




Hope to Light Your World

—John 1:4 NASB

Jesus is life, the eternal life. And He is the life-giving light in the darkness of this lost and hurting world. The word life holds so more than the facts of biology. This God-life offers us the blessing to enjoy true life that comes from Christ. It's energetic, fresh, and strong, bringing the vitality of God into the way we live and act. During Christmas, difficulty and hardship often mingle side-by-side with celebration. Truly, darkness comes in a variety of forms. When storms rage, we are caught off guard when the lights go out. We loose our bearings.

Disoriented, we grope and grasp, trying to find our way. It's all too easy to depend on ourselves to light the way--the how's and the why's of trying to somehow survive the confusion of the dark.

Darkness blankets hope with the heavy weight of difficult days. Hurting relationships, depleted finances, lost dreams, or broken hearts, life has no shortage of situations weary us under the weight.

Deep in the dark, we strain to see the choice to make or which way to walk. Reaching into our thoughts and emotions, shadows of anxiety, depression, grief, bitterness, or fear reveal our need for the light of hope.

On our dark days, whatever the cause, we look for the light. Difficult times can be especially hard at Christmas. Echoes from ages past, the prophecy becomes reality the blessed night Christ was born.

The people who walk in darkness

The light will shine on them.--Isaiah 9:2 NASB

The beautiful truth about light is the darkness cannot overcome it.

There is no dark so deep that the light of a single candle cannot shine. And there is no deed too dark that the purifying light of Christ cannot bring the saving grace of forgiveness.

Christmas beckons with the shimmer of true joy--the Light that ushers God's best into our worst.

Light to Receive Your Life

Soft light of a candle caresses the room, making shadows dance. A treasure of Christmas, light creates an ambiance that adds a special glow to these days we mark the coming of Christ. Yet, what we see is only a fraction of the full spectrum of light. From cosmic rays to infrared rays, our limited vision isn't equipped to see the full extent of light's power and presence.

There's so much we cannot see.

Doubt blinds our eyes to the light of Christ, distorts our view and diminishes our experience. Paul wrote words to penetrate the deep doubts that block our sight when we don't understand. "We live by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 4:18 NASB). Comparing faith with sight, believing is a way of seeing.

With the birth of Jesus, the glory of God took form, visible to our eyes. Generations scoured the night skies searching for a sign of the Messiah, faith looking forward with expectation.

Glory of God cradled His head in a meager manger stall. Stars beckoned His birth as angels lit the night sky announcing the miracle. Even so, light of expectation tarnished with doubt. Many didn't recognize prophecies fulfilled before their eyes. So many didn't notice. Didn't believe.

Many still don't.

The Light shines on in the darkness, and the darkness didn't understand it or overpower it or appropriate it or absorb it [and is unreceptive to it].-
John 1: 5 AMP

Grace to enlighten your heart.

Disconnected, discontent, or dejected, spiritual darkness keeps us separated from God, ourselves, and others. What we miss, when we don't live in the light of Christ. Sight adjusts to lack of light, yet we miss the blessings before us. The ones beside us.

Do we see the light coming for us, waiting for us? Pure, perfect, and steadfast, the holy life of Jesus illuminates every dark corner.



Did you catch a glimpse of hope to light your world? Grace to enlighten your heart and lighten your load is yours. Embrace the truth that you don't have to create the light out of your lack. You don't have to see the solutions or somehow, someway, do one more thing to muster the power to get through.

The life of Jesus lights us up, purifying hearts with holy fire. He is our great gift of righteousness--His right way of living, thinking, relating, and being.

Casting out the dark of loneliness and confusion, His light sets right our heart. Basking in the light of His glory, we see the saving of our souls from every dark thing. Informing, teaching, giving, understanding . . . transformation dawns day by day, even moment by moment.

God with us.

Blessing beyond all that glitters in this bent world, we don't have to search for the light, for love came down to us at Christmas.

Unwilling to leave us in the dark, separated from God, Jesus set aside His God-glory, the radiance of heaven. When light enters the dark, we see things differently. Shadows take form, confusion becomes clear, and we know we are no longer alone.

And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

--John 1:14 NASB



Taking on flesh, tender covering of infant skin, love lives among us. His name is Emmanuel, God with us. Living and dying that we might see. Raised again that we might share His life, to shine with the light of His glory.

No longer alone, the dark loses power to separate. To isolate. To devastate. Glory Baby, the eternal life and light of the weary world lives among us.

And we are no longer alone.



Saved by His Light

The Lord is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear?--Psalm 27:1 NASB

The dark has a way of sparking fear-based living and self-protective loving.

Have you noticed how hard it is to make declarations in the dark? Fear growls fierce in the absence of light. The Psalmist David faced dark days with a decision to hold fast to the light.

Naming the light, calling it forth and telling it true, David boldly put his eyes on God rather than the threat rising against him. Words of an earthly king defeat the dark with a simple practice to push back fear.

Salvation's light brings us to heaven, but it is also the light that gets us through the day. Light of God saves us from fear in our moment of need.

Faith forward, we find the words of John declaring Jesus is the life and light of men.

Saving grace for this holy moment.

Circumstances and emotions may run wild, but God never changes. What a difference light makes in the dark. Light for this very moment, what ever that may be, the word for salvation is translated *yesha'* in Hebrew. This saving grace includes deliverance, salvation, and rescue, but also blessings of safety, welfare, prosperity, and victory.

Salvation for heaven is also light for the moment. Consider the variety of the saving power of God:

- Deliverance from power of sin
- Saving from death to life
- Rescue from habits, ideas, and situations holding us captive
- Safety of knowing security as a child of God
- Welfare--our well being in the provision and life of God.
- Prosperity to fully live the light of Christ's life
- Victory over sin, lies, behaviors, failures

This light that saves is victory in the battle. Light of truth to overcomes despair. A few lines later in this Psalm, David admits, "I would have despaired unless I had believed that I would see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living (NASB)."

David experienced victory by not allowing his emotions to define his faith in the moment. He held tight to the unchanging truth that God is good even when dark days come. Light comes to our rescue as we embrace the life of Christ in this moment, this holy now.

The saving of God is both a one-time act, but also a daily relying on God's goodness. Look for the light, resist fear, and believe you will see the goodness of God in your life.

Isn't today the perfect time to step into the light with your own declaration of truth?



Reflect His Light

Dusk descends early on the shorter days of winter, but Christmas lights twinkle and shine like garlands of grace. Rays of joy, the lights of Christmas brighten the darkest season of the year.

Ever feel like if you don't do all the details, they won't get done? Like it's all on you to ensure the traditions, the gifts, and the goodies wait for your hands to do the work? Another aspect of darkness is the disorientation of our perspective.

Relying on self is a daily temptation. Here's the relieving and restoring truth: we are not the light. Bustling through the activity of this season, distraction dims the true light of Christmas. Short-sighted, this not-seeing the holy in our holiday comes easy in the busy of December days.

Too much to do, we get up earlier, work harder, and try to move faster. With visions of the perfect holiday dancing in our heads, we face the temptation to shift from living in the light to trying to be the light. *Trying to get it all right in order to be all right, every detail Pinterest-perfect.*

Plug into the power.

On these days, I come weary to the light as my resource as if the Holy Spirit merely gives a little boost to power me through the day. I forget, losing sight of the truth that I don't have to be the light for those around me.

There came a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to testify about the Light, so that all might believe through him. 8 He was not the Light, but he came to testify about the Light.

--John 1:6-7 NASB

John understood he was not the light.

No false sense of responsibility or self-importance dimmed his view or derails his purpose. Maybe today, you need the reminder, a relieving ray of hope that you don't have to produce the light with your own effort or performance.

Take a breath. Inhale deep and rejoice in the truth that God never asked you to create your own light, or anyone else's for that matter. Like John, simply tell the story of the Light. Reflect the wonder of His light in your life as you testify to His goodness.

Like the bulbs bright and sparkly on your Christmas tree or illuminating your front door, your role is to shine His light. Plug into your power source, the vital current of Christ's life to radiate joy. Share the light through encouraging words and acts of love, free from the burden of trying to be what we are not.

Clear about how to shine in the call of God, John understood he was to tell about the light, preparing the way for Jesus. Making room and making way, he tirelessly told the story of the Light that shines in the dark of sinful hearts separated from God.

Moments to share are moments to shine.

Light of the world and life for our souls, Jesus is the story to be told. Tell of His goodness in your life. Share the words that shed light in every dark place. These are words we need to hear, reminders of grace and beacons of hope.

We all live off his generous bounty,
gift after gift after gift.
We got the basics from Moses,
and then this exuberant giving and receiving,
this endless knowing and understanding—
all this came through Jesus, the Messiah.
No one has ever seen God,
not so much as a glimpse.
This one-of-a-kind God-Expression,
who exists at the very heart of the Father,
has made him plain as day.--John 1:16-18 MSG

We finally see it, grace to light the load as the true light penetrates with each expression of God's love. What a blessing to let go of the pressure of creating the light with our efforts. Tell the story of His light in your life, the wonderful words that only you can tell.

Moments to share become moments to shine, each testimony a light on the strand of His light in your life.



Unwrap the Gift of Grace

Good things come in small packages, or so the familiar cliche' goes. Visions of sweet babies and velvet boxes encasing iridescent diamonds come to mind. Value is not measured by the size of the gift, and our truest treasures are often disguised in the small things.

For of His fullness we have all received, and grace upon grace.--John 1:16 NASB

Riches beyond measure simply stated in 12 words. All we need waits in this one sentence. Every lack, every problem, every resistance, and every longing is filled in the life of Christ.

And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.--John 1:14 NASB

The ultimate gift was born, a baby with tiny fingers and toes. With the miraculous power of God, Jesus manifests the fullness of God given for us.

Unwrapping grace this Christmas.



Divine completion is what He offers, making us holy and whole through His life. The overflowing, uncontainable and unstoppable fullness of the Father comes with grace upon grace.

For it is grace that He offers to exchange His light for our darkness, His life for our sin. A completing gift to level our empty with God Himself.

Grace upon grace, look close in the light of the meanings of these words. The favor and mercy of God, grace is the undeserved blessing of forgiveness, restoration, abundance, and joy.

Grace of God given in Christ is a gift to be unwrapped with your life. How often have we left this precious gift unused on the shelves of self-sufficiency? How many times have we forgotten that we have the fullness of God's very life?



I hope there are gifts, wrapped and ready, waiting to be opened on Christmas. In the light of your Christmas tree, reflect on these questions:

What if you never open these gifts given with love? What will you miss?

Prayerfully open the gift of God's fullness with hands tearing at the wrapping of joy, eager for the light of grace to illuminate your heart in a fresh way this Christmas.

I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you will know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints . . . --Ephesians 1:18 NASB

If you have never truly accepted the gift of salvation, make this your moment to open the gift of eternal life. Don't wait and don't miss out. Opening God's gift of grace to light your darkness is simple: believe and receive.
